Bayonne to Hold Earth Day Clean-Up on Saturday, April 25th

Mayor Robert Kubert announced that he and the Bayonne City Council are inviting community members and groups to take part in a citywide Earth Day clean-up in Bayonne on Saturday, April 25th. Mayor Kubert said, “Earth Day 2026 is a great time for our community to come together to clean up our streets, sidewalks, neighborhoods, and public areas.” Mayor Kubert continued, “Numerous volunteers have worked for a cleaner Bayonne on Earth Day in previous years. Let’s do that again in 2026.”

City officials are inviting individuals, community organizations, and other groups of volunteers to sign up to clean a specific area of Bayonne on Saturday, April 25th, from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon. Interested organizations and individuals are invited to register as a team. People can either form a team to participate, or the organizers can place individuals on a team near where they live. In recent years, various teams, local businesses, and community groups have taken part. Mayor Kubert said, “We would like to encourage

previous participants to come back again to the 2026 clean-up. We would welcome new volunteers to join in this year's Earth Day clean-up.”

Interested groups and individuals must register by April 15th, in order to make sure there are enough supplies. The Bayonne Urban Enterprise Zone (UEZ) is coordinating the clean-up. Teams will be asked to take photos of the garbage bags collected, so that they can be displayed on Facebook.

After taking part in the citywide clean-up, all participating teams and individuals will be invited to a post-clean-up celebration and a group photo at Fitzpatrick Park from 12:30 p.m.-1:30 p.m. Fitzpatrick Park is located on Avenue C between 26th and 27th Streets, one block south of City Hall.

Mayor Kubert concluded, “Let's work for a cleaner community on Earth Day, Saturday, April 25th, and throughout the year. Thanks for supporting the 2026 Earth Day clean-up.”
