I. DESCRIPTION OF THE PROPOSED ACTION

A. Briefly describe the total development project

The City of Bayonne proposed to improve public access to the Newark Bay waterfront as well as provide resiliency and educational opportunities through the creation or rehabilitation of 1,400 feet of waterfront pathways. The project will connect existing waterfront pathways, extending continuous public access to the waterfront and restoring and eroded shoreline with a new stone revetment to stabilize the shoreline from future erosion. New exercise equipment, a reconstructed fishing pier, lighting and other amenities are proposed. For site locations see Figure 1 USGS Map and Figure 2 City Tax Maps.

The project site is an existing municipal park (Veterans Park) on the Newark Bay waterfront between West 25th Street and West 27th Street. Once completed, the project will connect to a recently-constructed, Green Acres funded, waterfront park that adjoins the project to the south.

B. State objectives of the project

The project has been designed to create enhanced public access to the Newark Bay shoreline, new recreational opportunities, shoreline stabilization, and innovative educational opportunities through the City's partnerships with local nature and environmental education organizations.



II. DESCRIPTION OF THE ENVIRONMENT

A. Veterans Park Site

Vegetation

The site is a developed waterfront park with maintained grass and some street trees. The shoreline consists mostly of rock and debris with limited evidence of existing vegetation.

Wildlife

Although the site is subject to some use by transient avian species, it does not exhibit characteristics that indicate availability of areas for nesting or foraging. The NJDEP Landscape Mapping (Figure 5) does not indicate records of threatened, endangered species habitat on or adjacent to the site. A request for records of threatened and endangered species habitat on the site has been sent to the NJDEP Natural Heritage Program (see Attachment 1). Result of the records search will be provided upon receipt.

Geology, Topography and Soils

Bayonne is located in the Piedmont Physiographic Province of the State of New Jersey. The NJDEP Geoweb mapping indicates that the site is located in an area with depths of 0 -50 feet to bedrock. The Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS) soils mapping indicates that soil series of the site is entirely LaGuardia Artefactual Coarse Sandy Loam. NRCS indicates that LaGuardia series consists of very deep, well-drained soils and that these soils occur on modified landscapes in and urban areas.

Water Resources/Hydrology

The site fronts on and includes a stabilized rock and debris shoreline along the Newark Bay. The Project is located in a flood hazard area (see Figure 3 FEMA FIRM). There are no other water resources on or adjacent to the site. NJDEP GIS mapping does not indicate the presence of freshwater or coastal wetlands on the site (see Figure 4 NJDEP Wetlands). The portion of the site below the existing revetment is subject to daily tidal flows from the Newark Bay.

Historic/Archeological Resources

The NJDEP GIS and the National and NJ Registers at https://www.nj.gov/dep/hpo/1identify/nrsr_lists/HUDSON.pdf (referenced on December 19, 2024) indicate one State historic property adjacent to the project site. This is Bayonne High School to the north (ID#5993). No other historic districts or historic properties were identified on or adjacent to the project site.

Transportation/Access to Site

The site abuts an existing developments and is accessed by a loop road around the park, called Park Road. This open access allows pedestrians, vehicles and bicycles open access to the park at all times.



Adjacent Land Uses/Description of The Surrounding Neighborhood

The Project is located adjacent to an existing athletic field complex and parking lot. To the East is a residential neighborhood. To the North of the site is Bayonne High School

III. ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ANALYSIS OF PROPOSED ACTION

A. Discuss all affected resources and the significance of each impact

Natural Features

The Project is located on the shoreline of Newark Bay in Bayonne where much of the shoreline has been previously developed and was historically claimed by industrial operations. In current conditions these shorelines are severely degraded and debris strewn. The Project proposes to improve the existing and dysfunctional stabilization, thereby protecting the shoreline, restoring eroded and degraded areas, and planting coastal-tolerant vegetation.

Construction of the Project would proceed in accordance with regulations for noise abatement, soil erosion/sediment control, and the requirements of approvals from NJDEP Division of Land Use as well as the US Army Corps of Engineers. These approvals provide conditions that will ensure that the construction phase, as well as the long term conditions, avoid adverse environmental impacts. The Project is expected to have an overall benefit to the Bay and habitat.

Threatened Endangered Species

Screening via the NJDEP Landscape maps indicates there are no records or threatened or endangered species habitats on the sites. It would be expected that the results of the Natural Heritage Database Search may indicate that the adjacent Newark Bay supports such habitats. However, the Project only proposes limited in-water. It should be noted that the Project will replace an existing stormwater outfall that discharges to the Bay but does not result in increased discharges to this outfall. As such, the Project would not be expected to adversely impact threatened or endangered species.

Soil Suitability and Erosion Control and Drainage

NCRS mapping indicates the sites are comprised of soil types associated with fill for previous development. The Project does not propose buildings or other structures that require extensive geotechnical analysis or fill. The project proposes to improve degraded conditions including repair of any eroded areas and planting of vegetation that will stabilize the sites. Further, construction will proceed in accordance with State and local regulations that avoid/mitigate potential for erosion and sedimentation.

Historic Resources/Visual Impacts

The only historic resource indicated is the Bayonne High School at the northern border of the project site. The Project proposes no activity that would directly or indirectly impact this resource. Further, the Project improves aesthetics on the site and provides increased visual access to the waterfront such that it only has positive impacts on this adjacent resource. Consultation with the State Historic Preservation Office (Attachment 2) has begun and will result in identification of any mitigation or required to protect/enhance these resources.



Site Access

The Project will result in increased pedestrian access to the site due to the improved amenities. The site is conveniently accessible by a loop Road with ample parking. Further, the site is located within an approximately six-minute walk from public transportation stops on JFK Boulevard. Further, the sites provide access to the Bay via improved access for recreational boating.

Nuisances and Hazards

Review of the NJDEP Geoweb data for Known Contaminated Sites, deed restriction areas, underground storage tanks, and chromate sites indicate no known presence of hazardous conditions on the site. Further, there are no nuisance producing land uses adjacent to or in the vicinity of the site.

Community and Land Use

The Project will provide increased and improved public access for the community. It is consistent with and supports the adjacent residential and recreational uses. It further supports the City planning goals for the community to provide improved waterfront access.

B. Discuss short term and long term project impacts

Based upon the above analysis of potential environmental impacts, it can be concluded that the potential for adverse impacts would only be temporary and construction related and would be mitigated through conditions in the required environmental approvals. Since the Project serves to improve a public open space and improves the environment (both human and natural) through eliminating dangerous conditions and cleaning up a degraded shoreline for use by the public, no adverse impact would be expected. The Project would result in only beneficial impacts to the sites and the surrounding uses and would provide open space and recreational uses that are consistent with the goals of the Green Acres Program.

C. Discuss anticipated increase in recreation and overall use of site over time

The express purpose of the Project is to improve and expand public walkways surrounded by improved open space. The project includes provisions for public seating, improved access for recreational boating and fishing and overall access to the Newark Bay. Since the Project will encourage active and passive recreation opportunities and preserve an improved open space, as well as, provide access to surrounding parks, the Project can be expected to increase public use of the sites and improve public access to the adjacent park uses. Therefore, this Project is consistent with the goals of the Green Acres Program.

D. Identify adjacent environmental features that may be affected by the proposal

The sites are located in an urban and disturbed environment with development on three sides. The only natural environmental feature is the Newark Bay. The project improves the existing revetment adjacent to the Bay and an existing stormwater outfall. It improves eroded areas and stabilizes the upland and shoreline areas thereby supporting function of the Bay; resulting in only beneficial effects on environmental features.

IV. ALTERNATIVES TO THE PROPOSED ACTION

A. Identify alternate sites

The Project goal is to improve City-owned and degraded waterfront property and to extend existing public waterfront walkways that are adjacent to the project sites. Therefore, alternate sites would not be feasible.

B. Discuss alternate levels and types of development

No-Action Alternative – If no action is taken, the existing waterfront access and dock will continue to erode and waterfront access will be substantially degrade and be unsafe.

“Hard” Stabilization Alternative – The shoreline could be alternatively stabilized with a steel bulkhead. This type of stabilization is discouraged by NJDEP and ACOE when more ecologically-friendly alternatives (e.g. rock revetment or living shoreline) are available. Therefore, it was eliminated from consideration.

“Soft” Stabilization Alternative - An alternative development would be to stabilize the shoreline with a soft solution (e.g. wetland plantings, living shoreline, etc.). The wave energy at the subject site is too energetic for such a solution to survive; therefore, it was eliminated from consideration.

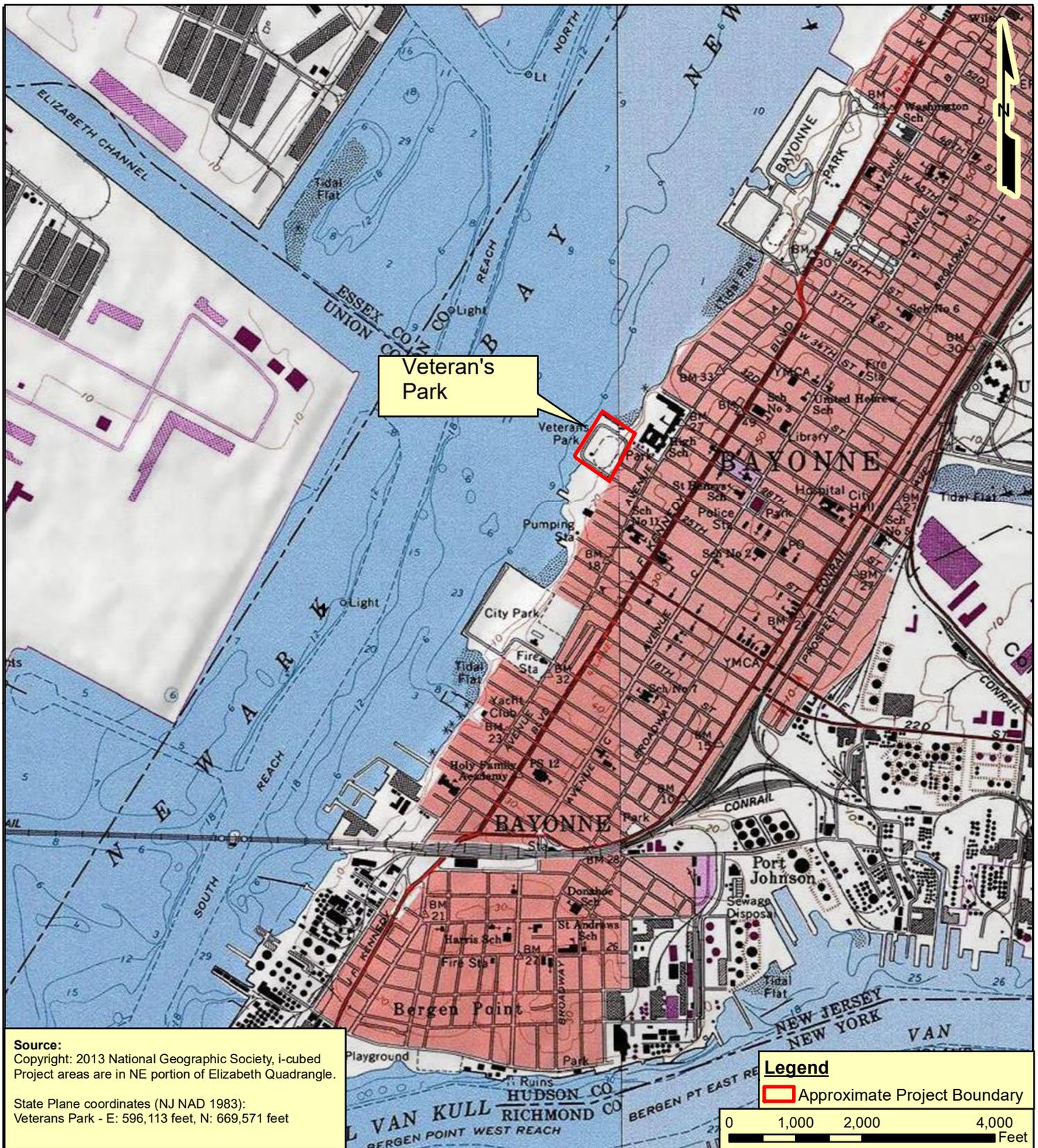
Preferred Alternative – The preferred alternative stabilizes the shoreline with a rock revetment that is appropriately designed for the wave conditions present at the site.

B. Compare environmental impacts of each alternative

The above analysis clearly indicates the Project would not result in adverse impacts, and in fact, provides beneficial environmental and community impacts. The No Action alternative would not provide these benefits and would likely result in continued degradation of the sites. Other alternatives may result in some improvement to environmental conditions on the site, but would result in waterfront properties that are only minimally accessed and utilized. Since these alternatives have no less adverse impact than the Project, this analysis concludes the Project is the most beneficial to both the environment and the community.

V. CONCLUSION

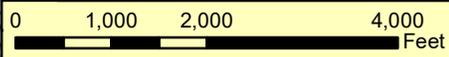

USGS TOPOGRAPHIC SITE LOCATION MAP

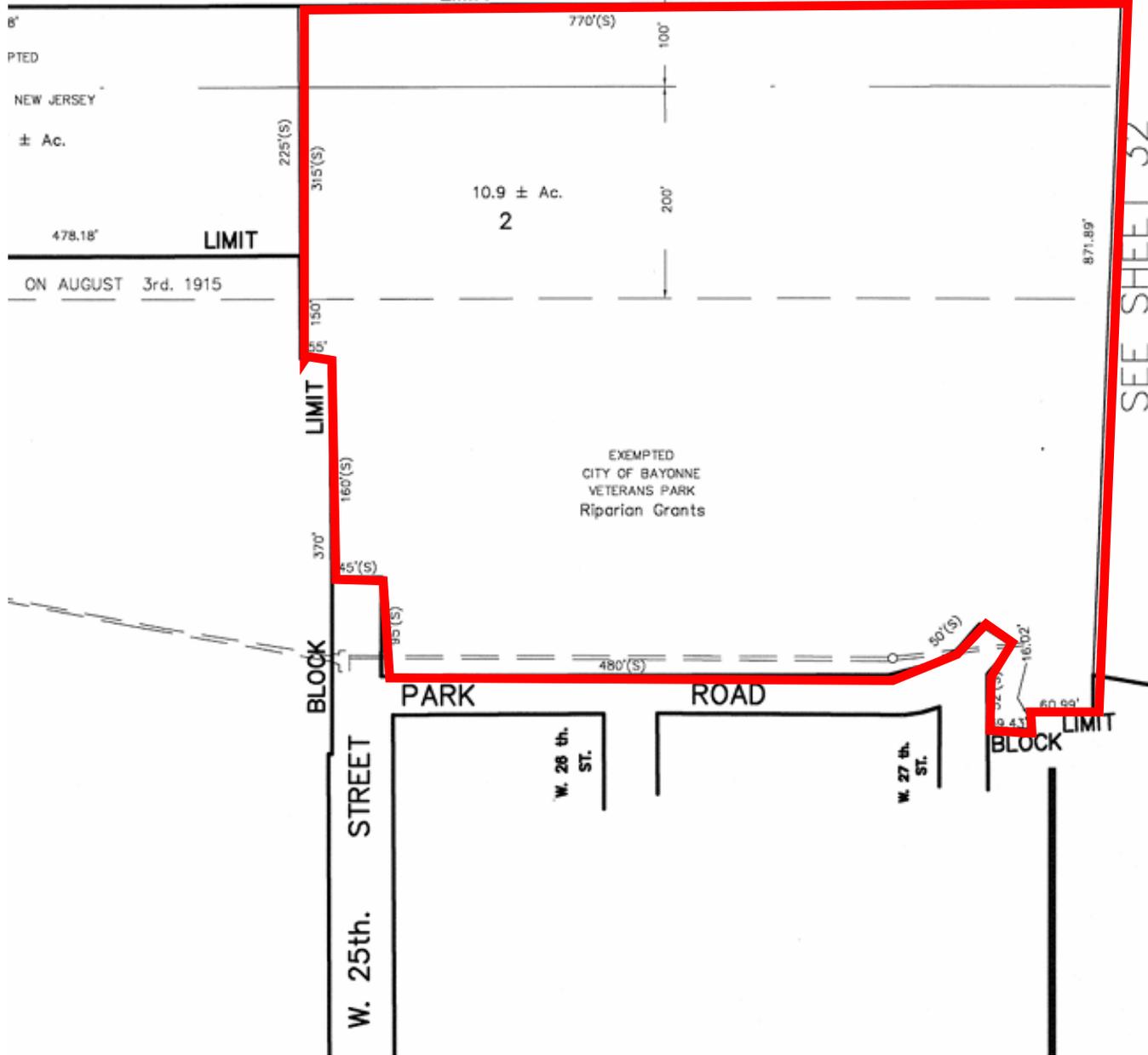

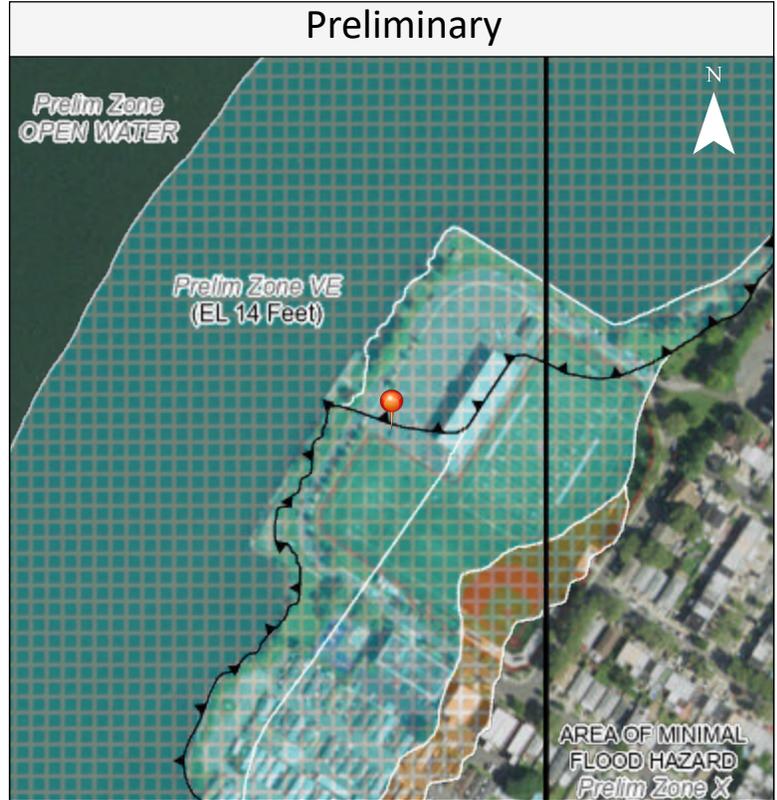

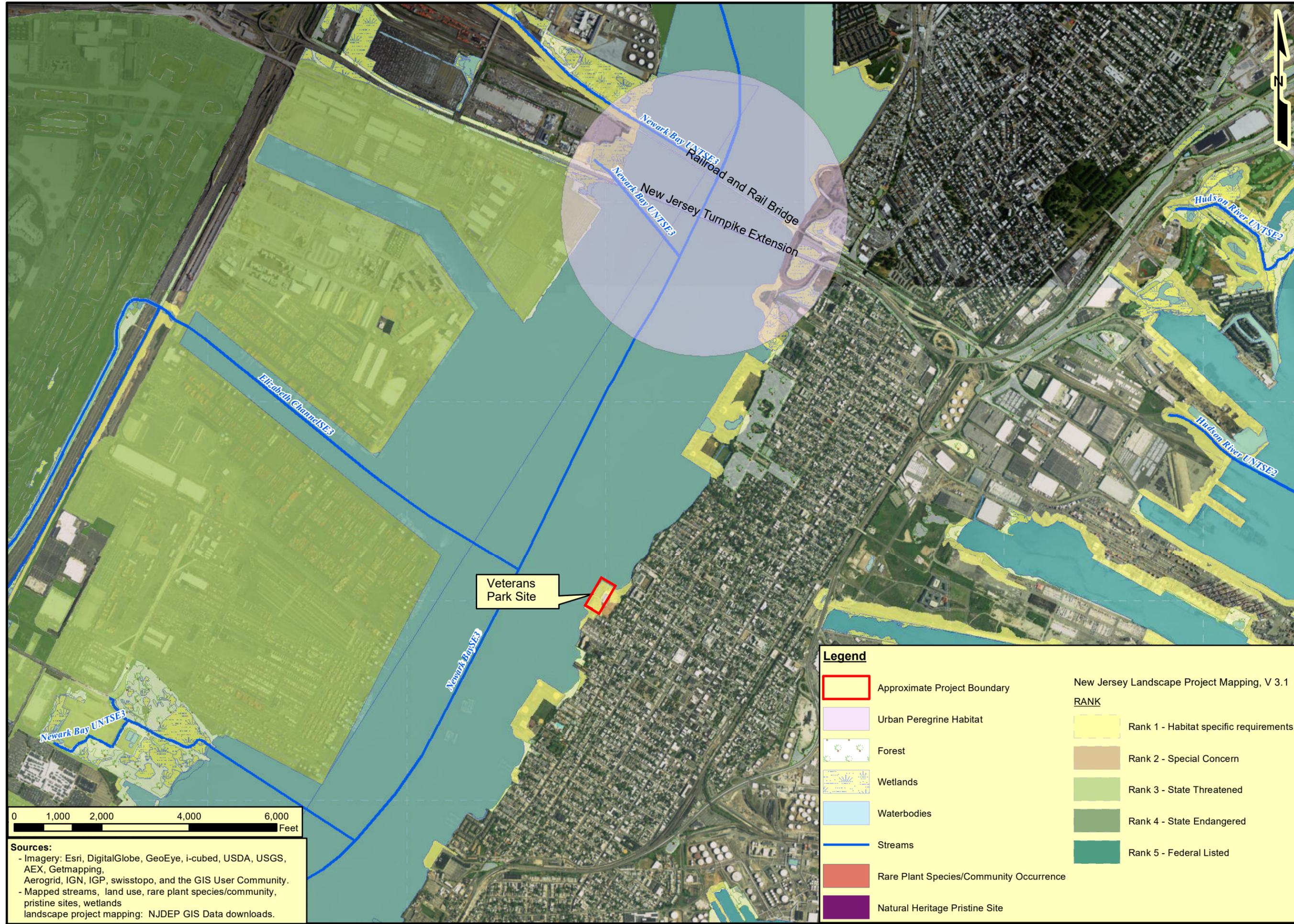
