OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BAYONNE, IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, NEW JERSEY, HELD IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, MUNICIPAL BUILDING, 630 AVENUE C, ON WEDNESDAY, APRIL 19, 2023.

07. Council President LaPelusa introduced:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BAYONNE, COUNTY OF HUDSON, NEW JERSEY ADOPTING AN AMENDED REDEVELOPMENT PLAN TITLED “AMENDED AND RESTATED MARIST REDEVELOPMENT PLAN” FOR THE PROPERTY IDENTIFIED AS BLOCK 13, LOTS 1.01, 16,17,18 & 18B01 AS SHOWN ON THE OFFICIAL TAX MAP OF THE CITY OF BAYONNE, PURSUANT TO THE LOCAL REDEVELOPMENT AND HOUSING LAW, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 ET SEQ.

WHEREAS, the City of Bayonne, in the County of Hudson, New Jersey (the “City”), a public body corporate and politic of the State of New Jersey (the “State”), is authorized pursuant to the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 et seq. (the “Redevelopment Law”), to determine whether certain parcels of land within the City constitute an area in need of rehabilitation and/or an area in need of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Redevelopment Law, the Municipal Council of the City (the “Municipal Council”) adopted Resolution No. 98-02-04-040, designating the entire City as an area in need of rehabilitation in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-14; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-7(e) and N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-15 of the Redevelopment Law, the Planning Board, through the City’s staff and/or Planning Board professionals, is permitted to prepare or amend a redevelopment plan; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution dated May 12, 2021, the Municipal Council of the City (the “Municipal Council”) designated the property identified as Block 13, Lots 1.01, 16, 17, 18 & 18B01 on the Tax Map of the City of Bayonne as an area in need of redevelopment under the Redevelopment Law in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-6 of the Redevelopment Law (the “Redevelopment Area”); and

WHEREAS, the City of Bayonne, Division of Planning & Zoning, Department of Municipal Services prepared a redevelopment plan for the Redevelopment Area titled “Redevelopment Plan Marist” dated November 24, 2021 (the “Redevelopment Plan”); and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board reviewed the Redevelopment Plan and, in accordance with the Redevelopment Law, and on December 6, 2021 conducted a public hearing wherein the Planning Board recommended the adoption of the Redevelopment Plan with several revisions, and concluded that said Redevelopment Plan is consistent with the Master Plan of the City of Bayonne; and

WHEREAS, following the Planning Board's public hearing, the Redevelopment Plan was revised to incorporate the aforementioned revisions and recommendations of the Planning Board, and now bears a revision date of December 8, 2021; and

WHEREAS, upon receipt and review of the Planning Board's recommendations relating to the Redevelopment Plan, the Municipal Council adopted the Redevelopment Plan, as revised through December 8, 2021, in order to effectuate a plan that is consistent with the goals and objectives of the City for the redevelopment of the Property; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution dated March 15, 2023, the Municipal Council directed the Planning Board to re-open the Redevelopment Plan and consider amendments thereto in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-7 of the Redevelopment Law; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bayonne, Division of Planning & Zoning, Department of Municipal Services prepared an amended redevelopment plan for the Redevelopment Area titled "Amended and Restated Marist Redevelopment Plan" dated March 31, 2023 (the "Amended Redevelopment Plan"); and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board reviewed the Amended Redevelopment Plan in accordance with the Redevelopment Law, and on April 11, 2023, conducted a public hearing wherein the Planning Board recommended the adoption of the Amended Redevelopment Plan, and concluded that said Amended Redevelopment Plan is consistent with the Master Plan of the City of Bayonne; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Council believes that the adoption of the Amended and Restated Redevelopment Plan is in the best interest of the City for the redevelopment of the Property.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BAYONNE, NEW JERSEY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The aforementioned recitals are incorporated herein as though fully set forth at length.

Section 2. The Amended Redevelopment Plan titled "Amended and Restated Marist Redevelopment Plan" dated March 31, 2023, for property identified as Block 13, Lots 1.01, 16, 17, 18 & 18B01 on the Tax Map of the City of Bayonne is hereby adopted pursuant to the terms of N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-7 of the Redevelopment Law.

Section 3. The zoning district map in the zoning ordinance of the City is hereby amended to include the Property per the boundaries described in the Redevelopment Plan and the provisions thereon.

Section 4. If any part of this Ordinance shall be deemed invalid, such parts shall be severed and the invalidity thereby shall not affect the remaining parts of this Ordinance.

Section 5. A copy of this Ordinance and the Redevelopment Plan shall be available for public inspection at the office of the City Clerk during regular business hours.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall take effect in accordance with all applicable laws.

08. Council President LaPelusa introduced:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING THE GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BAYONNE, CHAPTER 33, PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Municipal Council of the City of Bayonne, as follows:

Section 1. That the Revised General Ordinances of the City of Bayonne, Chapter 33, “PLANNING AND ZONING REGULATIONS” Section 12. “Application Fees and Escrow Requirements, is hereby amended and supplemented as follows (Additions **between asterisks and/or in bold**, deletions ~~{within brackets and/or struck through}~~):

**§ 33-12.6 Escrow Fees for Redevelopment Matters

- (a) Purpose. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-8(f) of the Local Housing and Redevelopment Law, potential redevelopers with the City of Bayonne (“City”) shall be required to enter into a Redevelopment Escrow Funding Agreement ("Funding Agreement") to cover the City's administrative expenses, evaluations, negotiation and approval of agreements, and other costs associated with the implementation and administration of redevelopment projects (collectively "Redevelopment Project Costs and Expenses") with the City. This Funding Agreement shall be a prerequisite to all Redevelopment Agreements and Financial Agreements with the City where the cost of the Redevelopment Project is as described below.
- (b) Escrow Funding Agreement and Procedures. The Funding Agreement acknowledges and binds the Developer to post an escrow with the City of Bayonne to pay the City's Redevelopment Project Costs and Expenses. This includes, but is not limited to, all legal, engineering and planning costs associated with the redevelopment. The Chief Financial Officer will establish an escrow account for the Redevelopment Project. The escrow deposit will be held by the City of Bayonne’s Division of Finance, for the expenses incurred by the Department of Planning, Zoning, and Development and Department of Law, and disbursed, pursuant to a Funding Agreement.
- (c) Escrow Amounts. Potential Redevelopers shall be required to make payments to an escrow account to cover the City's Redevelopment Project Costs and Expenses towards the potential redeveloper's project. The initial deposit requirement and, if necessary, the amount to be replenished shall be based on the cost of the potential redeveloper's project as described below:

Redevelopment Escrow Table	
Cost of Redevelopment Project	Escrow Deposit
Up to \$500,000	\$2,500
\$500,000 to \$1,000,000	\$5,000
\$1,000,000 to \$5,000,000	\$10,000
\$5,000,000 to \$15,000,000	\$15,000
\$15,000,000 to \$25,000,000	\$25,000
Above \$25,000,000	\$50,000

If, when and as often as may occur that the Escrow is drawn down to or below \$5,000 for escrow amounts greater than \$5,000 or is drawn down to or below \$1,500 for escrow

amounts \$5,000 or less, the Potential Redeveloper shall be notified and shall within 10 days of the notification provide to the Escrow Agent an additional amount sufficient to replenish the Escrow to the amounts set forth in this Ordinance.

- (d) The City of Bayonne shall create and have on file a model Funding Agreement with 1) the Department of Planning, Zoning, and Development and 2) Department of Law, to be completed and filed with the City before the City incurs any expenses for a redevelopment project.**

- b. *Chief of Lifeguards.* The chief of the lifeguards shall act as a lifeguard, supervise all lifeguards, assign all guards to their stations and shall be responsible for the performance by the lifeguards of their duties.
- c. *Lifeguards.* Lifeguards shall, under the supervision of the chief of lifeguards, constantly and carefully observe persons using the pool to prevent injury or loss of life and shall at all times prevent or stop all conduct by persons using the pool as shall be dangerous, indecent or unseemly.
- d. *Checks.* The checkers shall be stationed in the pool buildings for the purpose of receiving and returning clothing of patrons, issuing checks for the same and safely storing the clothing in receptacles provided for that purpose.

All persons employed at the swimming pool project shall perform such other duties as may from time to time be prescribed by the Director of the Department of ~~Municipal Services Administration.~~

WHEREAS, the Bayonne Community Day Nursery is a non-profit corporation established on July 6, 1969 for a public purpose; and

WHEREAS, by way of verbal lease, the Bayonne Community Day Nursery has been occupying the City owned premises located at 591 Broadway also known as Lot 9 in Block 171, and any appurtenant portions of related City owned property necessary for the operations of the Bayonne Community Day Nursery on the official tax map of the City of Bayonne (the "Premises") for the purpose of providing day care services to low and moderate income families of Bayonne regardless of their ability to pay; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bayonne and the Bayonne Community Day Nursery (the "Parties") desire to enter into a formal Lease Agreement setting forth the rights and obligations of both Parties in connection with said use and occupancy of the Premises; now, therefore,

THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BAYONNE DOES ORDAIN:

Section 1. WHEREAS, on December 18, 2019 this Municipal Council approved by way of Consent Resolution, Resolution No. 19-12-18-44 ratifying the actions of the Mayor of the City of Bayonne in executing execute a legal services contract with Tate, Grossman, Kelly & Iaccarino, of 1248 Montauk Highway, West Islip, NY 11795 for legal representation in connection with national litigation against manufacturers and distributors of opioids arising out of the manufactures' and distributors' fraudulent, negligent and otherwise wrongful conduct in connection with opioids manufacture and distribution; and

WHEREAS, on December 9, 2022 a Settlement Agreement was reached with CVS ("CVS Settlement"); and

WHEREAS, on December 9, 2022 a Settlement Agreement was reached with Walgreens ("Walgreens Settlement"); and

WHEREAS, on November 22, 2022 a Settlement Agreement was reached with Allergan ("Allergan Settlement"); and

WHEREAS, on November 22, 2022 a Settlement Agreement was reached with Teva ("Teva Settlement"); and

WHEREAS, on November 14, 2022 a Settlement Agreement was reached with Walmart ("Walmart Settlement"); and

WHEREAS, the proposed settlements will provide funds to states and their subdivisions for the abatement of the opioid epidemic and impose substantial changes on how the defendants conduct their business; and

WHEREAS, Teva has agreed to pay 3.3 Billion Dollars over a 13 year period, Allergan has agreed to pay 2.02 Billion Dollars over a 7 year period, CVS has agreed to pay 4.90 Billion Dollars over 10 a ten year period, Walgreens has agreed to pay 5.52 Billion Dollars over a 15 year period and Walmart has agreed to pay 2.74 Billion Dollars in 2023; and

WHEREAS, The New Jersey Attorney General's Office has "opted-in" to the proposed settlements and maximum participation of state and local governments is required for New Jersey to receive the maximum amount of settlement monies; and

WHEREAS, this settlement requires registration and participation by as many local subdivisions in the State of New Jersey as possible in order to maximize the amount of money coming to New Jersey based upon its incentive structure. For the purposes of settlement, counties and municipalities are considered separate subdivisions. Participants must opt into the aforesaid settlements to benefit from settlement participation; and

WHEREAS, Grantee has requested that the City permit certain physical encroachments within the public right-of-way adjacent to Grantee’s Property facilitate the construction of one (1) vestibule and two (2) windows in connection with the ground-floor commercial space located in the existing building on the Property; and

WHEREAS, the proposed encroachments within the public right-of-way are subject to Municipal Council of the City of Bayonne approval; and

WHEREAS, the City believes that the entry of an Encroachment Agreement over and on the City’s Property will allow for a building design that offers improved planning and zoning perspective that will benefit the City and its residents; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Council of the City of Bayonne agrees that conveyance of the easements to the Redeveloper is necessary, and as such execution and recording of said easements is appropriate.

NOW THERE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BAYONNE, NEW JERSEY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The aforementioned recitals are incorporated herein as though fully set forth at length.

Section 2. An Encroachment Agreement between the City of Bayonne and 746 Ave E Bayonne Urban Renewal, LLC for the purposes set forth herein is hereby authorized

Section 3. The Mayor or his designee is hereby authorized to execute the Encroachment Agreement on behalf of the City of Bayonne in such a form deemed advisable by the City Attorney or Special Redevelopment Counsel to the City, subject to any and all conditions contained herein, and such revisions as deemed advisable by the City Attorney or Special Redevelopment Counsel.

Section 4. A copy of this Resolution and Encroachment Agreement by the City of Bayonne for the benefit of 746 Ave E Bayonne Urban Renewal, LLC, shall be available for public inspection at the office of the City Clerk during regular business hours.

Section 6. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

WHEREAS, the Supervisor of Recreation and administration desire to exercise the City’s option to renew the Agreement No. CY22-054 for the term commencing May 1, 2023 and ending Labor Day, 2023 under the same terms and conditions; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, by the Municipal Council as follows:

1. The Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute an amendment to Agreement No. CY22-054 between the City of Bayonne and Joan Marie Tsirabddides t/a Lets Eat Concession, 34 Newark Bay Court, Bayonne, New Jersey for the operation of the food concession of the Municipal Pool extending same for the period commencing May 1, 2023 and ending Labor Day, 2023 for the amount of \$5,001.11 payable by Let's Eat to the City.
2. All other terms and conditions shall remain the same.

WHEREAS, the Municipal Council of the City of Bayonne in its capacity as the Rehabilitation entity (the "Municipal Council") for the City of Bayonne (the "City") is responsible for implementing redevelopment plans and carrying out redevelopment projects pursuant to the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 et seq. (the "LRHL"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the LRHL, the Municipal Council adopted Resolution No. 98-02-04-040, designating the entire City as an area in need of rehabilitation in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-14; and

WHEREAS, in 2017, the Municipal Council adopted a resolution authorizing and directing the Planning Board of the City of Bayonne (the "Planning Board") to conduct a preliminary investigation to determine whether properties identified as Block 416, Lot 3 (the "Property") constituted a non-condemnation area in need of rehabilitation; and

WHEREAS, on August 16, 2017, the Municipal Council adopted a resolution designating the Property as a non-condemnation area in need of rehabilitation ("Rehabilitation Area") and authorized the Planning Board to prepare a redevelopment plan for the Rehabilitation Area; and

WHEREAS, on December 12, 2017, the Planning Board prepared, reviewed and recommended that a redevelopment plan ("Redevelopment Plan") for the Rehabilitation Area to the Municipal Council, concluding that it was consistent with the Master Plan of the City; and

WHEREAS, on December 13, 2017, the Municipal Council introduced the Redevelopment Plan; and

WHEREAS, on January 17, 2018, the Municipal Council adopted the Redevelopment Plan for the subject Property; and

WHEREAS, Bridge Point Bayonne, LLC ("Bridge Point"), a Limited Liability Company of the State of New Jersey, with an office at 1 Gateway Drive, Parsippany, New Jersey 07054 is the owner of the Property and informed the City of its desire to redevelop the Property; and

WHEREAS, Bridge Point has requested that the City designate it as the Redeveloper of the Property and that the City engage in the preparation and negotiation of a Redevelopment Agreement for the rehabilitation of the subject Property; and

WHEREAS, at this time, the Municipal Council wishes to designate Bridge Point Bayonne, LLC as redeveloper ("Redeveloper") subject to the negotiation and preparation of a mutually agreeable Redevelopment Agreement; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BAYONNE, NEW JERSEY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The aforementioned recitals are incorporated herein as if fully set forth herein.

Section 2. Bridge Point Bayonne, LLC, is hereby designated as the Redeveloper of Block 416, Lot 3, subject to the execution of a Redevelopment Agreement between Bridge Point Bayonne, LLC and the City of Bayonne, which Redevelopment Agreement must be approved by this Municipal Council.

Section 3. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

WHEREAS, due to fire damage caused by a fire that occurred on April 11, 2023 at said Licensed Recycling Facility, Reliable was no longer able to receive the City's Paper Recycling Commodity; and

WHEREAS, due to exigent circumstances, the Director of Public Works retained All American Recycling Corp., 2 Hope Street, Jersey City, NJ 07307 ("All American") to serve as the City's Licensed Recycling Facility to receive and market the City's Paper Recycling Commodity as of April 12, 2023 payable at the rate of ten (\$10.00) dollars per ton payable to the City by All American; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the citizens of the City of Bayonne for All American to continue to serve as the City's Licensed Recycling Facility to receive the City's Paper Recycling Commodity pending the award of a new contract for same pursuant to the Fair and Open Process in accordance with N.J.S.A.19:44A-20.4 and 5; and

WHEREAS, the City is in receipt of a formal written proposal from All American to serve as the City's Licensed Recycling Facility to receive the City's Paper Recycling Commodity for said amount of ten (\$10.00) per ton payable to the City by All American;; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 17-07-22-069, establishing a procedure for the awarding of emergency contracts, the Director of Public Works provided written certification to the Business Administrator, Purchasing Agent and Law Director of the need for the emergency procurement of a Licensed Recycling Facility to serve as the City's Licensed Recycling Facility to receive and market the City's Paper Recycling Commodity April 12, 2023, and the Law Director determined and confirmed that the existence of the emergency and the provisions for emergency contracting pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6 were met; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, by the Municipal Council of the City of Bayonne as follows:

1. The actions of the Director of Public Works in retaining the services of All American to serve as the City's Licensed Recycling to receive and market the City's Paper Recycling Commodity as of April 12, 2023 for the amount of ten (\$10.00) per ton payable to the City by All American are hereby ratified and affirmed.

2. The Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized to execute an emergency contract with All American to serve as the City's Licensed Recycling Facility to receive and market the City's Paper Recycling Commodity for the amount of ten (\$10.00) per ton payable to the City by All American for period commencing as of April 12, 2023 until such time as a new contract for said services can be awarded pursuant to the Fair and Open Process in accordance with N.J.S.A.19:44A-20.4 and 5.

3. Written notification of the need for the emergency procurement of the aforesaid services shall remain on file with the Purchasing Agent.

4. The Purchasing Agent shall file an Emergency Procurement Report with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 30 days of the date this contract is issued pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.12.

5 . A notice of this action shall be printed once in a newspaper of general circulation within the boundaries of the City of Bayonne.

6. The Municipal Council hereby authorizes the advertisement of a Request for Qualifications/Proposals for the aforesaid Licensed Recycling Facility to receive the City’s Paper Recycling Commodity pursuant to the fair and open contracting provisions set forth in N.J.S.A.19:44A-20.4 and 5.
